ACTIVITY	DESCRIPTION
Fire-Lighting	The principles behind fire lighting, emphasising safety and respect for the environment. Students have the opportunity to make their own fire. Once the fires are successfully lit, the students get to cook their own burgers over the open flames.
Shelter Building	The students will learn why we need shelter when we are living outside and the types of shelter from different societies and nationalities across the ages. Tribes will build their own shelter, using natural woodland materials.
Cutting Tools	Students will learn about the different tools used in the field of Bushcraft, both primitive and modern, and reasons for their use. They will be taught safe handling techniques and will make their own tent peg.
Trap Making	The students will be taught why it is important to find food in remote settings, and how this has been achieved over the ages. Our instructors will demonstrate trapping methods, before each tribe designs and builds their own trap.
Bushcraft Challenge	The teams will participate in a series of fun but challenging initiative exercise that will really put them to the test, both mentally and physically. This is a great team-building activity and demands trust and communication.
Evening games	A chance to play games, sing songs and tell stories by the fire before bed time.
